What is **prior authorization?**

Prior Authorization is a process requiring physicians to obtain insurer approval before treatments are paid for by insurance.





How does prior authorization **negatively** impact patient care?





LOST TIME FOR CARE

hours a week

average time physicians spend on prior authorization paperwork

Who is **impacted** and why?

Each year thousands of patients in Virginia are denied or delayed the health care they need due to prior authorizations.



True stories from Virginia Patients...*

JOHN (Manassas, VA) had been on a medication for his rare disease for over ten years with his symptoms under control. After years of taking the medication, his insurance company required a prior authorization, which was denied. The appeal process took 6 months, ending in a court case. The authorization was still denied. The patient's disease and symptoms have since worsened.



ELIZABETH (Lynchburg, VA) was in the middle of a treatment plan prescribed by her doctor when her insurance plan changed. Her new plan no longer covered the treatment. Re-authorization took 2 months and her disease progressed significantly.





What is it **costing** us?

A national study estimated indirect and direct costs for prior authorization to be between

\$23 and \$31 billion



There are proven solutions...

In Minnesota, health plans and physicians worked collaboratively to implement a common sense solution to prior authorization.

The result was \$230 million in savings
